DIRECTOR-GENERAL NIALS VISITS NEW CJN

The Director General, Professor Epiphany Azinge (SAN) along with the Management Staff of the Institute paid a courtesy call on the newly appointed Chief Justice of the Federation, Justice Katsina Alu CON, FNIALS, at the Supreme Court Complex, Abuja.

Professor E. Azinge, SAN who led the delegation, in his opening speech, welcomed the Chief Justice into his new office. He expressed his delight at the appointment of the Chairman of NIALS Governing Council as the new Chief Justice of the Federation. He further congratulated the Chief Justice on his well deserved appointment, urging him to remain focused and avoid being derailed by malicious comments. The

Director General also stated that the institute would stand shoulder to shoulder in supporting the new Chief Justice as he pledges his (D.G.) loyalty to him.

The Director-General prayed that God should give the CJN good health, strength of character, and boldness in the face of daunting challenges. He encouraged the Chief Justice to lead by example so as to live a legacy that would be worthy of appreciation.

The newly appointed Chief Justice expressed his immense gratitude to the Director-General and his team. He gave all the Glory to God for his elevation and stated that the bible says "all good things come from above". The Chief Justice also spoke on the matter relating to the President's

absence at his swearing in to office, which regrettably had caused a brief controversy amongst critics.

In addressing the matter, reference was made to the Oath Act which states that the authority to tender oaths for the swearing in of a Chief Justice are the sole privilege of the President of the Federal Republic of Nigeria *or* the Chief Justice of the Federation. He was mortified at how members of the Legal profession could have misinterpreted a simple provision of the Act and referred to it as nothing more than an ignorance of the law as this was pure common sense.

He ended by urging all members of the institute to pray and keep praying.

Chief (Mrs) Folake Solanke, SAN

Chief J.S Odulate (founder and proprietor of Alabukun Patent Medicine stores, Abeokuta, Ogun State and Madam Esther Sekumade Odulate, both of Blessed Memory.

She attended Methodist Girls' High School(MGHS for short), Yaba, Lagos, in 1945 and during this formative years and early part of her educational history, her performance pointed to a bright future as she copiously displayed her natural brilliance, talents and versatility. Not only did she start from form 2 instead of form 1, but she also took the entrance examination in standard 5 instead of standard 6.

Between 1955 and 1958, she taught Latin and Mathematics in two different schools in England. She also had a stint in Yejide Girls Grammar School in Ibadan, where she taught Latin and Mathematics from 1958-1960.

Still reaching for greater heights she sought and obtained admission into Gray's Inn London for her professional training in 1960. In 1962, She passed the Bar Finals exams and was called to the Bar at Gray's Inn in 1963, subsequently to which she enrolled at the Federal Supreme Court of Nigeria, Lagos on Monday, March 31, 1963 as Solicitor and Barrister.

Chief (Mrs.) Folake Solanke (SAN) was born on 29th March 1932, to the well known Chief J.S Odulate Armed with knowledge in Mathematics, English, Latin and Law, She was set to become a dynamite in the legal profession. She returned to Nigeria and joined the Chambers of M. A Odesanya; now Retired Honourable Justice Odesanya, in Lagos, from August, 1962-May, 1963 and later moved to the Chambers of late Chief FRA Williams in Ibadan as Junior Counsel in 1963-1965.

Since 1966, she has successfully prosecuted over 100 cases for individuals, the Government and Cooperate Bodies. At all times, she showed industry, diligence and strict punctuality. It is only natural therefore that on the 5th of March 1981, She made professional history as the first female lawyer to wear the silk and be admitted into the Inner Bar of the Supreme Court of Nigeria.

Chief (Mrs.) Solanke (SAN) has carved a distinct niche for herself in two different careers of teaching and law practice, a feat which has earned her the description: "a woman of many firsts", "a pacesetter" and "a trail blazer". Most importantly, apart from the honour of being the first lady Senior Advocate of Nigeria, she was the first Governor of Zonta International District 18 (Africa) in 1982 and was elected the first non-Caucasian International President of the mother organization- Zonta International in 1992 which made her the 42nd President since the Organization was founded in 1919.

The numerous awards she has received at the national level include the following:

2. Hallmarks of Labour Foundation(Role Model) Award, 2004;

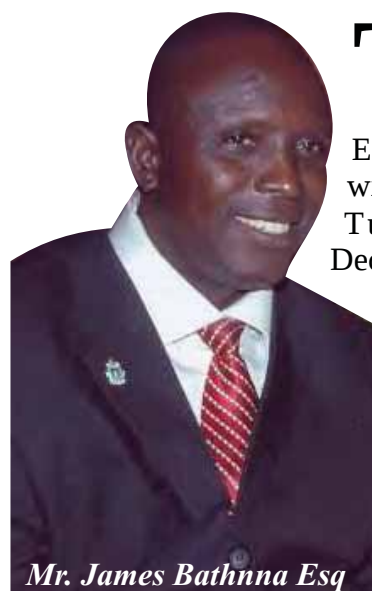

PROFILE



Hon. Justice Dr. Joseph Olakunle Orojo, an eminent jurist, erudite scholar and great educator was a scion of the famous Orojo family of

Ekitaji Quarters, Ilaja, Arigidi, Akoko North-West Local Government Area of Ondo State. He was born on February 16th, 1923. He started his primary education at St. Paul's School, Arigidi, between 1930 and 1936. He completed his primary education at the Jubilee Central School in Ikare 1936 and 1937. A child of promise, he proceeded to St. Andrew's College, Oyo, for his Secondary education between 1941 and 1944. Graduating on top of his class, he was accepted by the University College, now University of Ibadan in 1948 to study for his bachelor's degree; he graduated with honors in 1951. He studied Law at the prestigious University of London between 1952 and 1956 and was later called to the English Bar, Middle Temple, in England in 1957.

He engaged in private legal practice until he was appointed a lecturer at the Nigerian Law School, Lagos. His trajectory at the Nigerian Law School was steep; he rose to become Deputy Director (Director General) of the Nigerian Law School between 1968 and 1975, having succeeded Mr. G.R. Rudd. He laid a solid foundation for legal education in Nigeria and impacted positively and remarkably on the Bar and Bench in Nigeria.

The late Hon. Justice Dr. Joseph Olakunle Orojo was appointed a Judge of High Court of the defunct Western State

between 1976; a Judge of the High Court of Ondo State in 1976 and elevated to the exalted position of Chief Judge of Ondo State in 1978 where he served meritoriously in that capacity until his voluntary retirement in 1985. In 1983 he lived up to his unwavering conviction that the judiciary must not fail in its role as the bastion and bulwark against any semblance of evil and injustice in the celebrated case *Ajasin versus Omoboriowo*. The internal precision of his judgment in that case could not be faulted by the nation's apex Court which affirmed it.

A great institutional reformer, late Justice Dr. Orojo was the Chairman of the Nigerian Law Reform Commission between 1988 and the Chairman of the Council of Legal Education between 1999 and 2003. He consistently charted a direction to bring the law abreast of social, economic and political realities of Nigeria. A highly cerebral and prodigious writer, Justice Dr. Orojo has authored many books, among which are: Commercial Law and Practice [1983]; Company Law and Practice in Nigeria [now in its 4th edition]; Nigeria Company Tax Law [1979]; Conduct and Etiquette of Legal Practitioners [1979]; Professional Conduct of Practitioners (1979); Professional Conduct of Legal Practitioners in Nigeria (2008), and Law Practice of Arbitration and Conciliation in Nigeria (1999). He also contributed articles in local and international journals. In the twilight of his life, at age 85, he wrote three new books in 2008.

The Hon. Justice Dr. Orojo was a Fellow of the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators (U. K.) and contributed immensely to the development of the law and practice of Arbitration in Nigeria. An astute chartered arbitrator, Dr. Orojo was the Chairman of the Nigeria branch of the Institute between 1999 and 2003. He was concomitantly, the Chairman of the National Committee on the Reform of

Arbitration and ADR between 2006 and 2007.

As an Eminent jurist, he was consistently critical of the ethical value of the conducts of legal practitioners and a custodian of the highest moral standards of both the Bar and the Bench. He consistently advocated for professional and ethical excellence among legal practitioners and in collaboration with those who shared his conviction spearheaded the struggles which culminated in the enactment of the professional Code of Conduct Act in 2007.

A worthy patriot, Justice Dr. Orojo served his father land with distinction in a most remarkable and distinguished legal career. For his immense contribution to legal education, the national merit awards of the Officer of the Federal Republic (O. F. R.) and Commander of the Order of the Niger (C. O. N.) were conferred upon him in 1978 and 1983 respectively. He was a custodian of the highest standards of legal education in the country. Because of his conviction on the instrumental use of the law to further the economic goals and aspirations of the people and the State of Nigeria, he was a tireless advocate of Alternative Dispute Resolution. A Perfectionist, he brought uncommon diligence to bear on any task he applied himself. His friends and colleagues said of him, 'he made his mark in legal education, in legal practice, on the Bench and his efforts are indelible.'

Late Hon. Justice Dr. Joseph Olakunle Orojo died on 3rd July 2009. He was aged 86 years. M' Lords, distinguished ladies and gentlemen, I have the singular honor to present for the conferment of a posthumous award of the Institute's Fellowship, the late Hon. Justice Olakunle Orojo, 1923-2008.

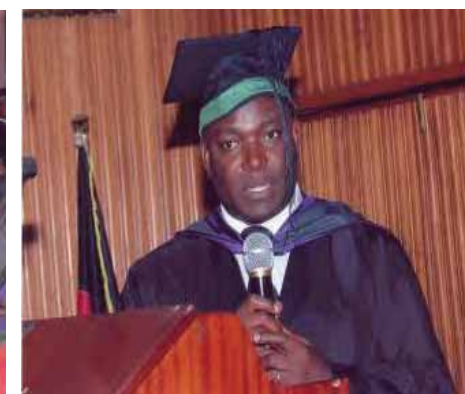

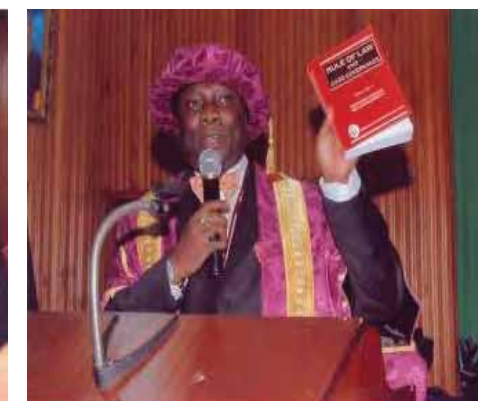
